Anatomy & Physiology: Muscles—Orbicularis Oris.

STRUCTURE.

- Origin: muscle fibers surrounding the opening of the mouth.
- Insertion: skin at corner of mouth.
- Superficial.

FUNCTION.

- Concentric action: closes and protrudes lips (like kissing); compress lips against teeth; shapes lips during speech.
- Eccentric action:

- Innervation: facial VII nerve.
- Arterial supply: facial artery.
- "Orbicularis oris kissed a hare and a tortoise".
